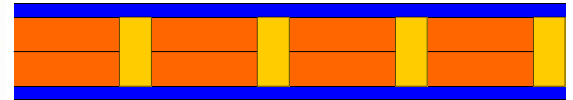

Many places have water miles from their homes so this project gets water closer to them. These wells are hand drilled and one well can serve 150 families. The residents drill the wells which can be from 20 to 70 meters deep.
