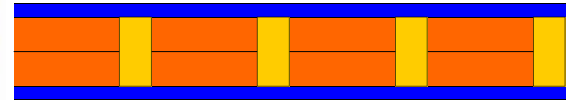

Plan to Build It and They Will Come We had a great turnout on Sept. 29 to build the wheelchair-accessible addition to the San Angelo State Park's Wildlife Viewing Center. This was my President's Project and Keith Perrine, who served as foreman, had every detail handled so we could get straight to work. Downtown Lions Club members joining Keith and me were Carol Cain, Dianna Cate, Jerry Hale, William Henley, Scott Patterson, Laurel Scott, Paul Stipanovic and Edie Troubfield. The park loaned us four Community Service workers as well. The project was blessed with cooler but dry weather and was completed by 3 p.m. Now, visitors in wheelchairs will be able to roll across crushed granite into the shelter to look out at the viewing area. Photographers, too, will enjoy getting a new angle on the birds and animals that visit for the bird seed and water provided. We also installed a low fence encircling the viewing area at the request of park Superintendent Jim Cisneros.

I am also grateful to Keith for taking the lead on this project and to all of you Dynamic Downtown Lions who sent me and your Secretary Sydney Dankworth to a Lions forum in Ohio. We learned a lot about the Leader Dog program and Spot Vision Screening.

Next up on our opportunities to serve: We have begun selling tickets to the next pancake breakfast, which will be on Saturday, Oct. 13, downtown. Please contact Merissa Swink for tickets to sell ahead of the event or to turn in ticket money. Thank you, Merissa!
